

Change Your Screen Color Scheme

Bonus Macro

For people who use a color VGA monitor, the included COLORSCM.WPM macro gives you nine screen color schemes to choose from.

CAUTION: This macro changes all of your screen colors in Setup and does not restore them. If you have selected a color scheme that you want to save, you'll need to record this information before running this macro or you will lose it. Do this by pressing Setup (Shift-F1), (2) Display, (1) Colors/Fonts/Attributes, (1) Screen Colors and write down the letters next to each option.

If you use COLORSCM.WPM, it will change all of these options. If you later want to return to your original custom settings, you'll need to enter them manually. If you normally use the WordPerfect default screen colors (blue), this isn't a problem since the first option in the macro is the WordPerfect default.

To use the macro, press Macro (Alt-F10), type *colorscm* and press (Enter). A menu of nine choices will display on your screen (see figure below). Press 1-9 (or the letter mnemonic) for the color scheme of your choice and your screen colors will change to the new selection.
