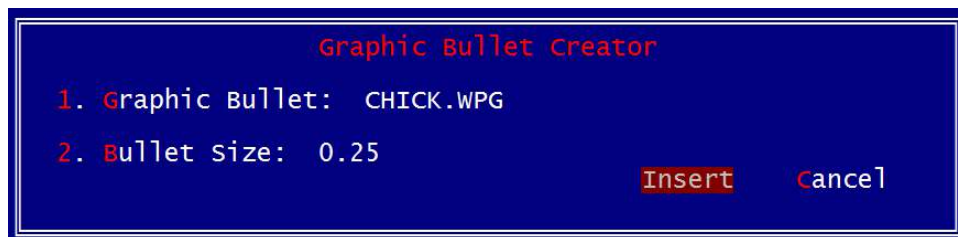


Use Graphics as Bullets  
WordPerfect Magazine  
Bonus Macros

The included GRPHBULL.WPM macro creates a bullet from one of your graphics at your cursor position. This will draw attention to your lists, specific sentences or paragraphs, etc. It will insert a graphic of your choice followed by an indent. You can specify the size of the graphic bullet as often as you wish. You will want to change your font size to accommodate the graphic you've chosen.

To run the macro, press Macro (Alt-F10), type *grphbull* and press (Enter). The Graphic Bullet Creator dialog box appears (see figure below).



To add the graphic bullet you want, press (1) Graphic Bullet:, highlight your choice of graphic (it brings up your default graphics directory; you can press List (F5) if you want to chose from a different directory), and press (Enter). To change the size of the bullet press (2) Bullet Size: and type the size, in inches, you'd like, such as 0.5 for half-inch high bullets.

You can press (C) Cancel at anytime to quit the macro.

Once you're finished customizing the bullet, press (I) Insert to create the bullet and insert it into your document.

You can rerun the macro as many times as needed. The macro remembers the last graphic and size you inserted, so you can quickly run the macro and press (Enter) to insert the previously created bullet again.
