I had a problem with my footnotes. No matter what font I selected for my research papers, the footnotes always printed in my Document Initial Base Font, in this case a Times Roman 12 point. Because of this, the footnotes took up most of each page.

I've solved the problem by writing the included FN.WPM macro. It automatically adds a new footnote to the paper and turns on the fine attribute in the footnote.

To play the macro, place your cursor where you want to create a footnote. Press Macro (Alt-F10), type "fn" and press (Enter). The macro takes you to the footnote editor, where you can type your footnote text. Press Exit (F7) when you're done.
