

Four Macros for Seeing the State of WordPerfect

STATE.WPM: Mitch Milam's WP 6.0 macro shows the state of system variables listed in the pull-down Help > Macros > System Variables Index, plus comments. The menu can copy the current state to the document screen. States are shown as numbers. There are no variables for font, font size, line spacing or display mode.

STATE62.WPM: An updated STATE macro shows variables new to WP 6.2. This may not work in earlier 6.x versions. If you can save it, it may work. In the macro editor, new variables are followed by "/" plus an explanation.

STATE1.WPM: This shows the state of the main screen. This is not Mitch's display. It cannot copy the current state to screen. It shows the state of display, font and more via Gordon McComb's ?entry method. It cannot be used in STATE.WPM because it invalidates ?dialog. Some states are shown as words instead of numbers. Numbers of the justification's state and menu do not correspond. There is no line spacing or paragraph states spacing because I cannot figure out how there is no ?entry shown in the line spacing dialog or in search and replace line spacing.

ALTX.WPM: This is a double-strike choice: Play the macro once for STATE1, quickly again for STATE62. You can rename it to another Alt-letter and double-strike it. It seems to work in all dialogs.
