

Hide and Show WordPerfect Screen Elements

The included HIDE.WPM and SHOW.WPM macros let you to combine the power of WordPerfect 6.x with the flexibility to hide screen elements so that your screen looks like classic WP 5.1. Then, when you need these elements, you can show them again with ease.

These macros work in both Text and Graphics Modes, but Graphics Mode is where you'll see the biggest difference.

Using the Macros

To hide everything except a blank screen, press (Alt-10), type "hide" and press (Enter). To show everything again, press (Alt-10), type "show" and press (Enter). That's all there is to it!

Warning

The SHOW.WPM macro restores all of the screen elements, not just those that you had customized before you ran the HIDE.WPM macro. For example, if you had the ribbon bar turned off before running the HIDE.WPM macro, that bar will nevertheless redisplay after you run the SHOW.WPM macro.

If you know that there are certain screen elements that you will seldom or never use, you can edit the SHOW.WPM macro by turning them off. Simply open the macro as a regular document. Replace "On!" with "Off!" or "Yes!" with "No!" where desired and then save the macro. Now, running the SHOW.WPM macro will not turn these elements back on.

These are the options listed in the macro:
